Mostly *Sarracenia purpurea*, displaying pitchers and remnant flowers. Perhaps the cold winter contributed to more vigor. They are native to Eastern US. Fragrance attract insect prey, live in swampy, boggy low nutrient conditions.

Spigelia marilandica, an *Lilium henryi*, an Asiatic type lily has down facing-flowers with no fragrance. Arching +6 ' stem indicates it is too shady. It was discovered in central China by Irish plant explorer Augustine Henry.



Lilium lankongense swollen pods show promise of successful pollination. Thin pods were not pollinated.

Origanum x hybridum ' Kirigami'
- seed grown, maybe Park
Seeds, sun, light shade



Helianthus ' Lorraine's
Sunshine'. , in light shade,
regular water. Planted a year
ago, seems to take the
extreme temperatures.
